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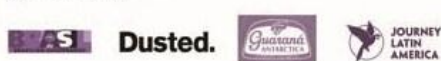

Discovering Latin America Film Festival will shine bright in London this month

From the 18th to the 28th of November the **Discovering Latin America Film Festival (DLAFF)** will reach its 9th edition exhibiting a compilation of the best recent film productions from Latin America. Award-winning films such as Argentine feature *The Secret in Their Eyes* (2009) and Costa Rican *Cold water of the Sea* (2010) will be exhibited in participating venues throughout Central London such as Odeon Covent Garden, Odeon Panton Street and Tate Modern.

The **Discovering Latin America Film Festival (DLAFF)** is the largest of its kind in the United Kingdom and for the ninth year promises to present the city of London with a wide variety of brilliant feature films and shorts, as well as exciting documentaries spanning the whole political spectrum, thrilling retrospectives, thought-provoking master-classes, enthralling discussions with film directors and many other events.

A chance to meet the 'Argentine Woody Allen' in person

One of this year's star guests will be renowned Argentine director Daniel Burman, whose introspective style has often been compared to that of Woody Allen. *Brother and Sister* (2010), the most recent of Daniel's films, will be featured in the fourth of the festival's gala nights on Tuesday 23rd of November. Daniel will be present at the screenings to discuss his work and show his support for the **Discovering Latin America Film Festival's (DLAFF)** cause.

Revenue from ticket sales will help a community project in San Salvador

Part proceeds from the 9th DLAFF ticket sales this year will benefit the **Salvadorian Children's Earthquake Trust (Salcet)**, a UK registered charity established in 2005 in response to the emergency and long term rehabilitation needs of children affected by earthquakes and other natural disasters in El Salvador and other vulnerable countries. The grant awarded to Salcet by Discovering Latin America (DLA) will be used to fund the construction of a sewage and drainage system for the San Carlos municipality, located in the northern outskirts of San Salvador.

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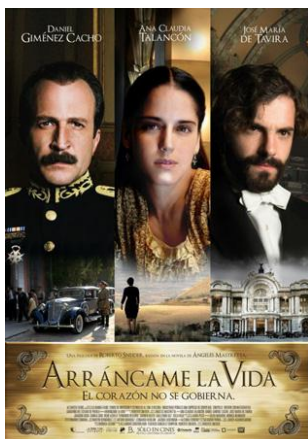

Opening Gala Night: Tear this Heart Out (2008)

On Thursday 18th November, 7:30pm at the Odeon Covent Garden, the 9th Discovering Latin America Film Festival will start on the right foot with a gala screening of the Mexican film *Tear this Heart Out* (2008), by Roberto Sneider.

Drama. 107 minutes. Synopsis: In the city of Puebla, Andrés, a former participant of the Mexican Revolution, meets Catalina, a beautiful young girl full of curiosity and desire to live a richer and more fulfilling life than her social background allows. She readily accepts when charming and powerful Andrés asks her to become his wife. However, Catalina soon discovers that wealth and money do not necessarily bring freedom and happiness, and that her generous and seductive husband is not the man of her dreams.



2nd Gala Night: The Famous and the Dead (2009)

On Friday 19th November, 8pm at the Odeon Pantón Street, the DLAFF will present a gala screening of *The Famous and the Dead* (2009), by Brazilian director Esmir Filho.

Drama. 101 minutes. Synopsis: A teenage loner and dedicated Bob Dylan fan who goes by the name Mr. Tambourine passes his time in the Brazilian countryside by looking at photographs and movies on the internet that feature a couple from his own town. The girl has recently died but Mr Tambourine is more fascinated by the mysterious and charismatic boyfriend that she left behind.



3rd Gala Night: Crab Trap (2009)

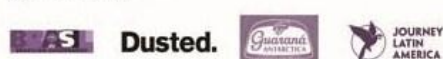
On Saturday 20th November, 8pm at the Odeon Pantón Street, the DLAFF will present a gala screening of Colombian *Crab Trap* (2009), by Oscar Ruiz Navia.

Drama. 95 minutes. Synopsis: A drama set in the isolated town of La Barra in Colombia's Colombia's Pacific coast, where an interloper, Daniel, arrives looking to flee the country and stays with Celebro, a local fisherman and leader of the Afro-Colombian community, who is trying to stop the construction of a beach resort. While waiting for his escape, Daniel befriends the locals and finds his destiny intertwined with the community of La Barra.

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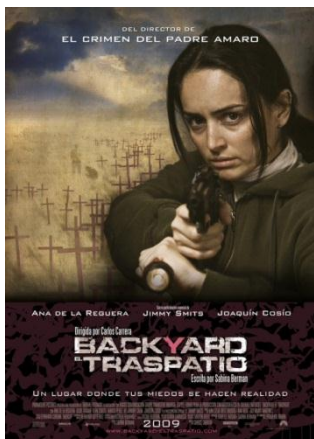

4th Gala Night: Backyard (2009)

On Sunday 21st November, 8pm at the Odeon Pantón Street, the DLAFF will present a gala screening of *The Backyard* (2009), by Carlos Carrera.

Drama. 122 minutes. Synopsis: The true story of the border town of Juarez, Mexico where since the mid-90s thousands of women have gone missing or turned up as sunburnt corpses in the desert. Can new police captain Blanca Bravo stop the savagery?



5th Gala Night: Brother and Sister (2010)

The acclaimed Argentine Director will be with us during the festival and a retrospective of three films will be screened: *Empty Nest* (2008), *Waiting for the Messiah* (2000) and *Brother and Sister* (2010).

Tuesday 23rd November, 8pm at Odeon Pantón Street. Comedy Drama. 105 minutes. Synopsis: They are both alone. They need each other but, at the same time, they despise each other. Siblings Marcos and Susana are unable to heal the old wounds festering between them after the death of their mother. When Susana sells their mother's flat, she deprives her brother of the home where he had cared for their mother his whole life. Marcos's need to start living again surfaces when his sister forces him to leave Buenos Aires for Uruguay.



6th Gala Night: Cold Water of the Sea (2010)

On Wednesday 24th November, 8pm, at the Odeon Pantón Street, the DLAFF will present a gala screening of *Cold Water of the Sea* (2010), by Costa Rican director Paz Fabrega (London Film School graduate).

Drama. 83 minutes. Synopsis: On New Year's holidays, Mariana (21) and Rodrigo (30) drive to the coast where he has to sell a property. There, they find Karina (7), late at night and in the middle of nowhere. She tells them she ran away from home and the couple stay with her throughout the night, determined to help her. In the morning, Karina is gone but the couple remain haunted by what the girl has told them.

Daniel Burman, Argentina

Burman is of Polish-Jewish descent, and he was born and raised in Buenos Aires in the seventies. He holds both Argentine and Polish citizenship, like his films' character, Ariel. He studied law before changing to audiovisual media production. In 1995, he launched his own production company together with Diego Dubcovsky, BD Cine (Burman and Dubcovsky Cine). Burman is a founding member of the Academy of Argentine Cinema. His loose trilogy of films, *Esperando al Mesías* (2000), *El Abrazo Partido* (2004), and *Derecho de Familia* (2006), were all written and directed by Burman and star Uruguayan actor Daniel Hendler. They are largely autobiographical, dealing with the life of a young neurotic Jew in contemporary Buenos Aires. His comedic touches often bring comparison to Woody Allen and his films have been featured in many film festivals around the world. *El abrazo partido* (2004) took the Grand Jury Prize at the Berlin International Film Festival, as well as best actor for Hendler. Burman was co-producer of the successful 2004 film, *The Motorcycle Diaries*, as well as *Garage Olimpo* (1999).



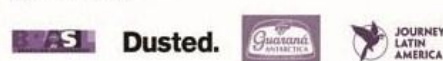
Paz Fabrega, Costa Rica

Paz Fábrega was born in 1979 in San José, Costa Rica. She studied still photography, and journalism before going to the London Film School. She shot her graduation film, *Temporal*, in rural Costa Rica in 2006. The film has been in competition in *Clermont-Ferrand*, *Tampere*, *Uppsala*, *Biarritz* and many other international festivals. Her second short film, *Cuilos*, shot in San José, in 2008, premiered in August 2008 in *the international competition of Locarno Film Festival*. *Cold Water of the Sea* is her first feature and was a finalist for *Sundance/NHK 2008*. Her past and current projects deal with loneliness and the vulnerability of youth, placed in the very particular context that is Costa Rica; a small country with amazing geography and landscapes, and a degree of isolation from the rest of the world, with many stories untold.

Eduardo Lucatero, Mexico

A graduate of Concordia's Mel Hoppenheim School of Cinema, Eduardo Lucatero is a Mexican-Canadian filmmaker who has worked on a variety of television and film projects in both countries. His first feature, 2007's *Corazón Marchito*, demonstrated Lucatero's strengths as a writer who could mould a satisfying character-driven drama that balanced charm and warmth with pitch-black humour. His new film *Prelude* is a deceptively simple full length single-take film that craftily distils Lucatero's interest in character and realistic dialogue over formulaic plot devices. Both the story and the camera follow two unnamed strangers at a party over the course of a conversation with too many cigarettes, too much tequila, and one entirely inappropriate Cancer joke. The characters also become familiar to us as well, as Lucatero uses this experiment in eavesdropping to invite us to become his voyeuristic accomplices (text by Ricky D.)



Leonardo Garcia Tsao, Mexico

Leonardo Garcia Tsao, Mexican film critic, currently is published in the daily newspaper La Jornada. He also teaches film courses at the Centro de Capacitacion Cinematografica.
